

THOUGHTS ON MEMBERSHIP

What a Rotarian should NOT be:




Financially distressed
Lacking integrity
Racist or a bigamist or a misogynist
A hermit
Dogmatic and egocentric
Have a victim mentality
Must not arrive with their own agenda for financial gain
A push over

What a Rotarian SHOULD be:

Have social influence
Be realistically positive
Be transparent
Successful in their field of endeavour
Ideally an active citizen (e.g. residents associations, school bodies, church etc)
Financially independent
Sociable
Reasonably presentable
Have a can do – outlook
Live reasonably close to where club meets
Racial and Religious diversity is ideal





Over the past couple of years, I have given Membership a considerable amount of thought and time. Many hours were spend following up leads by Rotary International, which in turn I forwarded to AGs and or club representatives in the District.

It taught me some interesting things.





-  Most AG's don't open their emails or respond or say thank you.
-  Most new possible candidates were to be found in the Pretoria, Johannesburg, Polokwane, Mozambique and Gaborone/Botswana areas
-  Most candidates thought Rotary to be a platform for personal gain, either in the form of bursaries or NGOs trying to make Rotary part of their financial endeavours.

Quality versus Quantity:

From my time as DG whilst visiting clubs I noticed:

-  Smaller clubs are quite happy to be small and do not really make an effort to change as the members are comfortable in each other's company and avoid new members.
-  Smaller clubs with less than 10 members are not sustainable but should either merge or become Satellite clubs of larger viable clubs.
-  Larger viable clubs have better trained Rotarians and are to be found in the bigger urban areas.
-  A pleasant differentiation of that observation were the Eswatini and Mozambique clubs, who are doing their Rotary with a lot of gusto and enthusiasm.

In the beginning of the year I consulted DG Maurice Stander and we aligned ourselves on the following:

-  Do we push the clubs to invite as many potential members as they can or do we ask clubs to look for potential Rotarians, that are likely to stay in Rotary?
-  Do we accept that smaller clubs actually have no future in District 9400 and promote that they can merge?
-  Do we promote the possibility of starting Satellite clubs?
-  Do we promote the idea for those who cannot afford to be Rotarians, to be friends of Rotary?
