

100 Years of Rotary in Africa

April 25 1921, a moment in time 45 signatures to form the first Rotary Club on the African Continent were submitted to the International Association of Rotary Clubs (now Rotary International).



Charter 976 was granted on **1** July 1921 to the Rotary Club of Johannesburg, and the Rotary Wheel started to turn on the African Continent.

These two black and white photographs below show the 45 charter members of the club with Edward C Fischer and other guests in attendance.



100 Years later the Rotary Club of Johannesburg is still creating lasting change Dr Angela Long was inducted as the 101st president for the Rotary Club of Johannesburg on the 4th of July. The following Rotarians received a Service Above Self recognition: Thembeka Mkhize; Angela Long; Clifford Alexander; Jean Mboulé; and IPP of the Interact Club James Lowman. Rotarian Nick Wood was named Rotarian of the year.





Wheelchair Gives a Child Greater Access to Society

A child with a disability and without a wheelchair is not able to socialise with the world around them. Travelling with them becomes a challenge. Most would be bed-bound or have to find their way around by crawling, as it was with 5-year-old Martha Makhuloane. Little Martha was born deformed and unlike her peers, had to crawl or be carried around. This was a feat as her mother Emily is diagnosed with stage 4 cancer and finds it difficult to carry her as she gets tired frequently. Martha relied heavily on her grandmother who is challenged as she has to take care of an additional 10 children.

The impact that not having a wheelchair on children like little Martha has, is that they are not able to access health care systems and education without the assistance of a wheelchair which renders them immobile. Click <u>here</u> for more on this story.

Take Up the SOUNS Challenge

The SOUNS project, run by the Rotary Club of Pretoria East (RCPE), has placed over a hundred SOUNS sets in crèches in Gauteng, Limpopo, Mpumalanga, KZN, Mozambique, and Eswatini.

Usizo Lwethu School is a special needs school in Daveyton, Johannesburg that caters to 420 children living with Down Syndrome and Autism. To support their educational needs, the school needs to provide special learning aids which they are not able to afford.

The Club visited the school and learned of its highly successful vegetable garden that the children are involved in, to support the school's feed scheme. This is when it was realised that there is a need to get involved by supplying more than food.
