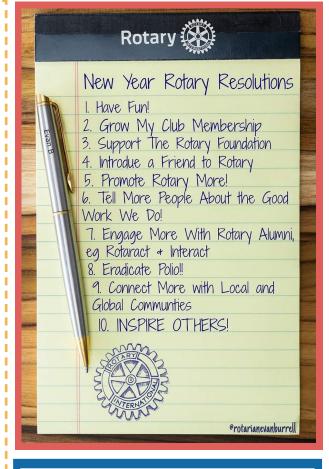
The wheel is the purest, simplest visual representation of all that we have achieved and all that we are yet to accomplish. We all have an important role to play in being custodians of the Rotary brand.
